Chairman's Report

During the parish council year ending in May 2023, we welcomed on to the council two new parish councillors, Christine Egerton-Smith and Andrew Hodgson.

The parish precept was set with no increase. This is now 12 years without an increase.

The Council continued to support local amenities including the Christmas tree and lights at the entrance to Heapey Chase, grass cutting, fencing and notice boards. Contributions continued to be made for play area maintenance in Wheelton and War Memorial expenditure and a grant given to Heapey and Wheelton Village Hall. Donations were also made to the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal and the Chorley Help the Homeless Community Appeal.

Councillors attended the Remembrance Day Service at the War Memorial in Wheelton.

The council made representations on a number of large planning applications in Heapey or adjacent to Heapey. These included objections to the Black Lion Field proposals next to Blackburn Road, and the Paradise Street proposal with access from Heapey Road. Objections included inadequate infrastructure for the developments and road safety concerns.
